But how far does this song go? Some historians point to a 1719 opera called Kingdom of the Birds, in which a character sings: In the fields in Frost and Snow, There I keep my father's cows, Booing here, Booing there, Every where a Boo, We challenge all care and struggle. In a charming country-life, In 1908, a 74-year-old woman in a London work house was recorded singing a song called The Farmyard. Up was I on my fa-ther's farm On a May day tomorrow-ing ear-ly; Feeding the cows of my fa-ther On a May morning-ing day ear-ly; With a moo moo here and a moo moo there, Here a moo, there is a moo, Here a moo, Here a pret-ty moo. Six pret-ty maidens come and gang me to the mer-ry green fields in the farm yard. In 1917, a more recognizable version was published in a collection of World War I songs: Old Macdougall had a farm in Ohio-i-o, and on that farm he had some dogs in Ohio-i-o, with an arc-wow here, and an arc-wow there, Here a bow, there a wow, everywhere an arc-wow. The most modern version simply wobbles from a variety of free-range animals with the accompanying sounds, each verse adding the previous sound to a long string until, at the end of the song, the children are mooring, neighing, barking, meowing, quacking, and clucking. The song can continue as long as the singers are patient and can think of new animals to add to the repertoire. With origins dating back to the 1870s Wales, This Old Man is a fairly established nursery rhyme. What is believed to be the original version was not published until 1937, however, and the version that is familiar to most of us was published in 1906. Some historians have also suggested that the most modern version was driven by a well-known pervert who would offer to play paddywhack with young passers-by in a certain colonial city. The song circulated as a way for the villagers to let the old man know they were about him, and to warn the children away from him. An even earlier version was told and published by Anne Gilchrist, who said she learned it from her Welsh nanny. With its quaint language, the lyrics are clearly earlier than the old man version, and is appropriately innocent as a children's song.
